Shantivan, Panvel

Ashramshala at Shantivan , Panvel, was started in 1994 to provide education to the children of tribal communities and bring them at par with educated citizens of India. The school has expanded since then and had 100 percent SSC result last year. Leprosy Hospital (under Kushtarog Niwaran Samiti, KRNS) at Shantivan helps in treatment of the said patients. The latest multi drug therapy and prevention of deformity by reconstructive surgery of cured patients , are applied in the hospital. Jersey Cow Unit provides milk at a reasonable rate to the children of Ashramshala, Leprosy Patients, and also caters to the senior citizens of old age home, and social workers. Our Club donates generously to help a child project, Rs. 2,500/- per child per year, midday meal for the ashramshala children or for the leprosy patients, Rs. 5,000/- per day and for cow fodder Rs. 750/- per

LIFE JOURNEY WITH INNER WHEEL

This Story is about how, Inner Wheel Club of Bombay helped a member to change the course of her life, to achieve a purpose in life and in the process gained friends who became her family.

This story is about me (Jyoti Doshi). I'll try and be as brief as I can; Inner Wheel is a passion and philosophy in my life so I do tend to get carried away.

The story begins in the year 1993-94 when then President Rekha Tanna invited me and inducted me as a member. The first few months went in understanding this organisation. I was fascinated to see these groups of women conducting meetings so systematically. Every Appeal for funds was debated for its benefits to the Society, it's authenticity established and only then was taken up, money collected and donated. Some members regularly visited institutions and helped in various ways. Since this was the first time out of my Ivory Tower, (a little about my background. I came from a very protected environment and got married into a well known business family, so once again into a very protected environment) Inner Wheel was quite an eye opener. One day a Senior member Ms. Mrinal Kher called me to be part of a Project at Seva Sadan. It was at 2.30 pm. I thought to myself that how can I give up my afternoon

siesta. But Mrinal's enthusiasm won and I was there at Seva Sadan. And rest as they say is history.

I became aware of this other belly of Mumbai. Soon I was part of doing my bit for Social Goal. I realised that even though money was important, giving your time and energy by Volunteering was equally important.

I was asked to be the Treasurer. I learnt all about banking, maintaining accounts, receipts, Audited Accounts. As the Hon. Secretary, it was fun writing the minutes, preparing reports. A whole new world had opened up. As the President I got to be known on my own merits. This was the most satisfying year.

My teacher in School had penned in her farewell note to me – 'Always Do Usual Things Unusually Well'. Magically these lines flashed before me when I was being installed as the President. I made it my mantra.

I was encouraged to go to the District and that proved to be another learning graph. Lessons learned are too numerous but I would like to recount some of them :

i. Every woman has talent and one has to learn to spot it.
